SAL

[Pause - this is hard] When I heard the scream, my first thought was - just run - it's gonna look bad for you. Someone else was running too, and I told the cops that, but I don't think they believed me. Like I said, I've done bad things, you can ask my mother. But every minute of every hour of every day since that night I've been asking myself - why'd I run? Marty wasn't dead yet, maybe I could have helped her, saved her even. I didn't kill her, but I did run ... so maybe her dying is still my fault. I'm just looking for someone - anyone - to hear me, you know?
